## What is C-FARE?

The Council on Food, Agricultural, and Resource Economics (C-FARE) is a non-profit organization dedicated to enhancing the application of economics to food, agricultural and resource issues at the national level. Incorporated in 1993, C-FARE's governing board includes applied economists representing a wide range of public and private sector interests.

The four primary goals C-FARE outlined to complement the agricultural, natural resource, environmental, and applied economics profession include:

- 1. To identify key economic issues, establish priorities, and seek support for applied economics research, extension, and academic instruction;
- 2. To help applied economists contribute more effectively to public and private sector decisions;
- 3. To work with other professional organizations to foster support for food, agricultural, and resource research;
- 4. To publicize applied economics contributions to solving important societal issues.

## **C-FARE Successes in 2008**

- Provided 24 newsletters on items of interest at the federal level.
- Conducted 40% more educational and informational opportunities for policy makers and stakeholders than in 2007.
- Reduced travel expenses and time for event participants by offering 3 webinars on various topics.
- Experienced a 100% increase in the number of students with an interest in agriculture and economics reached with information on opportunities in Washington, DC.
- Met with 43 Congressional Offices to provide economics information.
- Attendance and representation from C-FARE at six professional society meetings.

## **Contributing to Public and Private Sector Decisions**

#### Appropriations Testimony

Providing testimony allows the profession's priorities in federal funding to be heard. C-FARE prepared testimony jointly with the Consortium of Social Science Associations (COSSA) for the House and Senate Appropriations Chairs regarding key research programs for the FY 2009 Agriculture Appropriations bill.

## "Environmental Choices: Outlook and Investigation on Climate Change as It Relates to Agriculture and Natural Resources"

On April 1 and May 20 C-FARE and AAEA sponsored symposiums addressing the impacts of climate change on agriculture entitled, "Environmental *Choices*: Outlook and Investigation on Climate Change as It Relates to Agriculture and Natural Resources." - More than 200 policy makers, stakeholders and others attended at combined events.

#### April 14 Multi-Disciplinary Briefing on Biofortification

"Designer Crops: Building Health and Nutrition from the Ground Up" was developed to explore the nutrition, agronomic, and economic tools and technologies that can be applied to understand and overcome chronic hunger, malnutrition and the diseases resulting from these problems in both developed and developing nations. The multidisciplinary briefing was held on April 14 on Capitol Hill and Dr. Alex Winter-Nelson (University of Illinois) participated on behalf of C-FARE. - 40 policy makers, stakeholders and others in attendance at combined events.

## July 9 Multi-Disciplinary Briefing "After the Fire: Approaches to Revitalizing Ecosystem Resources"

Three scientific experts addressed what science knows about managing lands after the fires have burned. Dr. Stephen Swallow (University of Rhode Island) participated on behalf of C-FARE. - Over 100 Congressional staff and stakeholders were in attendance. Met with five Congressional Offices.

#### August 5 Meeting with OSU Delegation and Scientists

Congressional staff met to discuss the importance of an interdisciplinary approach to researching food policies. Dr. Neal Hooker (The Ohio State University), and C-FARE Intern, Deb Van Camp represented C-FARE. - Met with five offices from the Ohio Congressional Delegation.

#### Input to CSREES on AFRI Program

C-FARE attended the public hearing and provided written comments to CSREES regarding the new Agriculture and Food Research Initiative (AFRI) which was authorized in the 2008 Farm Bill.

## **Communicating Within Our Profession**

#### **Council Caller**

C-FARE produces three Council Caller newsletters a month focusing on issues of interest to agricultural economists from the federal level.

#### Industry Economists Luncheon

Starting in 2008, C-FARE held a series of lunches for industry economists. Speakers and topics include:

- March 3 we welcomed Dr. Joe Glauber, USDA Chief Economist, for a trade update. 13 individuals attended.
- June 2, we were pleased to welcome Dr. Clay Ogg from EPA to discuss environmental implications of biofuels. 8 individuals attended.
- September 8, Dr. Jeffrey Harris, Chief Economist with the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, discussed futures markets. 20 individuals attended.
- December 8, Steven Koenig from USDA'S FSA discussed the market and credit situation for agriculture. 13 individuals attended.

#### Intern Briefings

During Summer 2008, C-FARE held three intern briefings for students interning in Washington, DC with an interest in agricultural and applied economics. - The briefings combined reached about 60 students from across the country.

## **Working With Other Professional Organizations**

#### BESC/CoFARM April 8-9 Congressional Visits Day Event

C-FARE invited Dr. H.L. Goodwin (University of Arkansas) and Dr. Hayley Chouinard (Washington State University) to participate in the Coalition on Funding Agricultural Research Missions (CoFARM) and Biological and Ecological Sciences Coalition (BESC) Annual Congressional Visits Day (CVD) on April 8-9, 2008. Participants received a review of the federal budget from key leadership working with research issues, including the leadership of the USDA REE Mission area. - The economists representing C-FARE met with 10 Congressional offices.

#### The National Coalition for Food and Agriculture Research (National C-FAR)

National C-FAR is a nonprofit, nonpartisan, consensus-based and customer-led coalition that brings food, agriculture, nutrition, conservation and natural resource stakeholders together with the food and agriculture research community, serving as a forum and a unified voice in support of sustaining and increasing public investment at the national level in food and agricultural research, extension and education.

- A congressional briefing on Climate Change was held on March 31 with C-FARE sponsored speakers, Dr. Bruce McCarl (Texas A&M University) and Dr. Brent Sohngen (The Ohio State University) - reached over 50 Congressional staff and stakeholders and met with three Congressional offices.
- On Monday, September 29, 2008 Dr. Parke Wilde (Tufts University) participated on behalf of C-FARE in a multi-disciplinary briefing on food prices. Dr. Ephraim Leibtag (USDA ERS) moderated the question and answer portion of the presentation. Over 60 Congressional staff and stakeholders and four Congressional offices visited.
